Welcome to Drayton Avenue Presbyterian Church! To those visiting with us, we pray that you will encounter the presence of the risen Christ in our midst. Today is the **30th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Liturgically speaking, “ordinary” refers to “that which is standard, normative, usual, or typical.” Ordinary Time is thus “standard time” for us as people of faith. It focuses our attention on the day that is normative for all of our life and worship -- Sunday or the Lord’s Day -- the Day of Resurrection. Today is also **Reformation Sunday** when we celebrate the faithful witness of our Protestant forebears and recommit ourselves to their motto: “The Church reformed, but always being reformed by the Holy Spirit according to the Word of God.”
